

# **Marystown-Burin Area**

#### Alert level 3

- Marystown and surrounding communities are now in **Alert Level 3**: <u>https://www.gov.nl.ca/covid-19/alert-level-3/</u>.
- **Sacred Heart Academy** will be initiating virtual learning on Monday, October 25. All other schools on the Burin Peninsula have implemented enhanced public health measures as advised by Public Health.
- **Non-essential travel** from the Burin peninsula area to other areas of the province is not recommended at this time. Travel in and out of areas identified in alert level 3 should also be limited within the Burin peninsula unless deemed essential.
- Stay at home as much as possible. Those at higher risk of complications due to COVID-19 should not go out, except to get essentials like groceries and medications.

#### Public health update

- The investigation of a cluster of COVID-19 cases related to the Marystown and surrounding area is ongoing. The source of the cluster is under investigation. New cases are being identified daily and contact tracing is underway.
- To date, there have been **39 confirmed cases of COVID-**19 connected to the cluster. The majority of cases identified in the cluster are under 20 years of age.
- Ongoing contact tracing has identified a school outbreak as part of the investigation. Other community
  activities and organizations involving children have also been impacted, including after-school programs,
  child care, and sports such as hockey, skating, and swimming.
- Identified cases are in isolation. Anyone who is a close contact will be contacted by public health and given
  instructions specific to their vaccination status.

## COVID-19 testing clinics update

- COVID-19 testing is by appointment only. To book an appointment, individuals can complete the COVID-19 self-assessment and testing referral tool online at <a href="https://covidassessment.nlchi.nl.ca/">https://covidassessment.nlchi.nl.ca/</a>.
- Additional COVID-19 testing is in place for the area with extended hours. Including today, we will have tested 974 individuals and over 400 appointments are booked for tomorrow.
- A temporary by appointment only drive-through clinic will be held at the Marystown Community Service Building, 10-12 Harris Drive Industrial Park on Sunday, October 24 from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Full details at: <u>https://news.easternhealth.ca/2021/10/22/eastern-health-opens-additional-drive-through-covid-19-testing-on-the-burin-peninsula/</u>.
- Test results are usually available within 24-72 hours. Individuals are directed to follow public health guidelines for self-isolation and retesting.
- Individuals can call 811 if unable to complete the online assessment to book a COVID-19 testing appointment.

## Local health operations update

- Hospital and health care centres remain open. Temporary visitor restrictions for hospital patients and long-term care and personal care home residents at all facilities and sites on the Burin Peninsula are now in effect. - Individuals who are not seriously ill are reminded to avoid hospital **emergency departments**. In case of an emergency, individuals should go to the nearest emergency department or call 911 for an ambulance.
- Those who are experiencing any one or more symptoms of COVID-19, should complete the COVID-19 self-assessment and testing referral tool online at <a href="https://covidassessment.nlchi.nl.ca/">https://covidassessment.nlchi.nl.ca/</a>.
- If there is a change in a person's health status, individuals should contact their regular health provider or call the NL Health Line at 811 / TTY 1-888-709-3555, to speak to a registered nurse 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

# COVID-19 vaccine clinics update

- COVID-19 vaccines are safe and effective. Anyone who is eligible to get COVID-19 vaccine is encouraged to do so. COVID-19 vaccine clinics are scheduled for:
  - Marystown (Wamic Holdings Ltd., McGettigan Drive) on Oct. 27, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. by appointment only, and from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. walk-ins welcome.
  - Marystown (Wamic Holdings Ltd., McGettigan Drive) on Nov. 3, 10, 17 and 24, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Walk-ins will be accepted as capacity allows.
  - Grand Bank (50+ Club,17 Riverside Drive West) on Nov. 17, from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Walk-ins will be accepted as capacity allows.
- Clinics will be offering first and second doses of vaccine to individuals 12 years and older.
